



As you can see, we are not short of ideas for the upcoming Biketober (we also have a rally and road safety leaflet campaign pencilled in for the month); what we really are short of is ... people with time and the inclination to help make this the biggest and best Biketober yet held!

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### NATIONAL CONFERENCE REPORT

Canberra was the venue for the annual National Conference, and the long weekend in January, the time. The Clubman Rally was on the following weekend, which would have been great to go to had time permitted, as quite a few South Aussies went over and enjoyed themselves immensely, as usual. Ah well, next time, maybe. Anyway, I reckon the conference was pretty constructive, which made up for it, but I'll leave it up to you to decide. Here are the main points that arose.

1. Each Branch to investigate the feasibility of a Government/Industry — funded helmet replacement program (i.e. inducement to trade in old helmets for new in the interests of safety, with a side benefit derived from testing the old helmets to come up with better standards).

2. Each Branch to investigate the feasibility of pushing for 5/25 helmet exemptions (i.e. if you have 5 years' experience or are over 25 years old you would not have to wear a helmet).

3. The next MRA National Rally to be held over Easter '89 at a site more accessible to WA than Broken Hill (which probably means SA). We are to look for a National Rally Coordinator for '89, and others willing to help, so would those interested please contact me by the end of March.

4. Branches to discuss life membership, with guidelines being finalized at the '89 National Conference.

5. Focus on how MRA Australia can better use the services of the Australian Motorcycle Council.

6. Rallies in some states are major fundraisers, provided all work and catering is done by the MRA. SA to discuss the feasibility of holding our own state rally (subject to finding a suitable site).

7. Wider national promotion of the Toy Runs.

8. Branches to consider the feasibility of horsepower/ power to weight ratio limits to replace the existing 250cc law. One suggestion is that learners' bikes be limited to 1 HP/5 kg up to a maximum of 160 kg, with usable power over two thirds of the rev range. The weight of the rider must also be taken into account here.

9. The Federal Government says that we will eventually suffer either running lights or lights-on legislation, whatever we do, say, prove, or disprove. Branches are to begin a campaign against lights-on at their own discretion.

10. There is a need to develop short -, medium -, and long -term goals with high, medium, and low priorities for MRA Australia. Those determined at the conference are:

(a) Finalize the constitution and become incorporated

(b) Become financially stable. For this we need general purpose and special purpose fundraisers. We will aim to raise \$1000 for National Rally expenses and \$5000 for general revenue in 1989.

(c) Finalization of the policy document in 1989.

(d) Increased accessibility to MRA Australia.

(e) National uniformity of services provided for bikers by the MRA.

(f) Obtain Federal funding for MRA activity in road safety, rider training, rider education, and Motorcycle Awareness Month. Branches are to research methods of organizing a national campaign to reduce road trauma in the long term, and to make drivers more aware of motorcyclists in the short term.

Branches are also to research the profile of the driver most likely to be involved in motorcycle collisions, and to prepare a discussion paper on what each thinks it should promote/act on re reducing road trauma. These ideas will be implemented, and after a suitable period of time the profile of the driver will again be researched to determine the effectiveness of the campaign.

(g) Branches are to make a valiant effort to double membership in 2 years. Each state is to determine their own method of achieving this. This goal will kick off with a one-day national membership drive on March 5 this year.

(h) The first issue of a national MRA magazine will be produced by January 1990, with a bulletin including information on the states' activities ready by January '89.

11. Branches are to request action by the AMC on increased import duty tariffs on bikes and spares, based on there being no local industry to protect.

12. A watch is to be maintained on Government activity which might result from any research reports on open-face and full-face helmets.

13. Most states have legislation re window tinting and stuff in cars which obscure vision (towels in windows, fluffy dice, etc.), but which is not enforced. Branches are to push for enforcement at their own discretion.

14. The MRA 10th anniversary will be promoted as the Victorian 10th (May 16, 1988). Individual state branches will promote their own at the appropriate time.

15. We now have a National Research Officer, Annaliese Caston, who is the A.C.T. President. She will maintain a record of all research done by Branches, and coordinate and initiate research as the need arises.

Other points of less general interest were also discussed at the conference. Feel free to call me if you want more info, or if you have some comment on the points mentioned.

#### **4 B's REPORT**

Before taking over as Co-ordinator of 4Bs in July 87 things had been very stagnant. The 4Bs had nothing to keep interest going, members were starting to drop out and we were having only four members turning up for meetings. Then things started to take off for us.

Firstly; besides being a MORAL SUPPORT group for Bent and Buckled motorcyclists in the hospitals, we felt it was about time people started to take more notice of us, not only as 4B members but as ordinary CARING motorcyclists. That's when we thought the RECOVERY SERVICE needed a good boost. So we made up some cards about service, with phone numbers etc on them, and every 4B member went out in full force, placing, giving, talking to every motorcyclist – placing them on bikes etc etc. Soon the message was on almost every ones lips about our service. HEY, WHAT A GREAT IDEA, WE NEED A SERVICE LIKE THAT – EX-CELLENT – SURE WILL KEEP THIS CARD AND WILL HAND THEM ONTO FRIENDS etc etc are some of the comments we received. Whether you are a MRA or 4Bs member or not, we will pick you up.

We had a slight hitch when we first started our service, as we had a WINCH on the trailer, and this IS classed as a TOW TRUCK, yes how stupid, but that is the law. So got in touch with the MRA Lawyers in Angus St CITY, and found out what was what. In turn we got in contact with the Registrar of Motor Vehicles Tow Truck INSPECTOR and he was more than very helpful to assist us with the Service. So Alf had to go and get a Tow Truck Licence didn't he. Yes I got the Licence and away we go. We now can charge a fee for the Pick-up service. We are charging \$20.00 city limits, outside limits eg. Past Gawler, and Reynella and Inglewood areas, we've set a fee of \$40.00. This service is run on a VOLUN-TARY BASIS and is a service — not a business.

Then one Friday afternoon we got a phone call from the FLEURIEU TOURERS MCC saying that they had raised \$200 for the 4Bs to be used for Maintenance for the Recovery service. The donation was from the DEEP CREEK RALLY '87. committee. So any of you who participated in this rally we THANK YOU SINCERELY.

We also got in contact with a few of the Motorcycle clubs to ask if we could talk to their members about the 4Bs in the way of our Hospital visits to injured motorcyclists, our Recovery service, our Fund raising for St Johns Ambulance. The response was dismal, so if there are any clubs out there wishing us to come along and give a talk you will find that a lot has happened of late. Please give us a ring on 263 2446 and ask us anything you want to know, make a date and we will be very happy to give a talk to your members.

Our hospital visiting is progressing with R.A.H. being well covered and our members seem to be really enjoying their work. Remember 4Bs is a voluntary group of dedicated people and are very well received by patients and the staff. Imagine being in hospital with other patients in the same ward who don't understand you because you ride a bike and then this group of 4Bers pop in to see you, or if you are in traction flat on your back and all you see is the ceiling. How would you feel, - rotten? Of course you would. Then we pop in to see you, cheer you up and all you can say is, "How is my bike and when I get out of here I want to go for a ride, it's such a lovely day etc." Most people who have accidents WILL get back on a bike, maybe not straight away but in a year or two when they have healed their wounds. There are a few guys who have lost a limb and they are back out there riding again. Dedication is the word. If you know of anyone in hospital who would like a visit from us, please give us a ring on the above number and we will arrange something for you. We have a magazine library, and also we can arrange a LAWYER for you too.

We had a 4B Conference earlier this year held at HAY, NSW with members from NSW, ACT, VIC and SA taking part. It was quite successful for the very first 4B Conference. Many thangs were discussed and all had great time.

We were also told by the Lord Mayor of Hay that next year we would have the KEY TO THE TOWN and that there would be media coverage for us as we decided to do a BLOOD RUN for the town. So anyone interested in coming along next August, or any Registers who have any queries please don't hesitate to contact us.

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
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### TOY RUN REPORT

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**MRA MARCH '88 – 7** 

### **TWO R's ON THE ROAD**

We set off on Thursday night, right after work, and amazingly on schedule. Roy's (Michael's) R100RS took the tent and most of his gear, while Linda's R80 carried his wet weather gear. We made good time till Gawler and stopped for the night at Terowie (before we both fell asleep on the bikes).

Earlyish Friday morning we were on our way toward Broken Hill. Lovely place, but very hot, which was getting to Roy, as the fairing was keeping the engine heat in too. We were travelling fairly slowly and stopping often for breaks most notable was Topar pub, (between Broken Hill and Wilcannia) — just desert and a pub. We were pretty buggered by the heat, (this is where Roy said he would "swap the BM for a Fairlane with airconditioning") so we pushed on after dark to reach Cobar. "Watch out for the Roos" all the locals were warning us, but we didn't have any problems with them, they just seemed to wander off the road or sit and stare at us. The suicidal sheep however . . . but we avoided hitting any.

The weather was a bit overcast Saturday morning at Cobar (the locals were hoping for rain) which turned into a light drizzle about 10km down the road. This was really nice compared to the day before's heat. Later still it rained in earnest. Just past Dubbo we were hoping to make our next stop before the rain, but were pushing on as it was at our backs — could we outrun it? No. As we rounded a corner, IT hit — pouring rain that reduced visability to less than ten feet, we dropped our speed down to a crawl and lent hard against the wind. However, when trees started dropping limbs designed to get us, we decided to call it a day and stayed at Dunedoo to recover and dry off. The lightning and thunder show was quite spectacular (when you are safely indoors at the pub, with beer in hand).

Sunday saw the rain gone, but still overcast. Somehow we weren't too lively getting moving, so we got into Karuah river Rally at 1.30 pm. We just missed out on the awards — longest distance was 1200 and we had done 1700 so we would have bolted in. Actually, we were glad we didn't push on Saturday night, as the rain had raised the river level through the causeway and heaps of people camped on the wrong side of the river, to cross into the rally on Sunday morning.

After a refreshing COLD swim in the river, we set off again, to visit with Linda's relatives at Toronto on Lake Maquarie (only 100km away). There we swam, fished and generally were very relaxed and lazy.

Monday we did a lap of the lake on Linda's bike - about 100 km, very pretty. Stopped for a swim at Caves beach. The surf was really great after the calm gulf waters of Adelaide.

Tuesday saw Roy sorting out the points that were still wet from Karuah (bet you were wondering why we took Linda's bike yesterday eh?). Then more fishing — where we caught Wednesdays tasty breakfast of bream, flounder and tailor.

Wednesday we set off midmorning for the trip into Sydney. We took the highway which was mostly boring except for the bit through Kuringai National Park, which is great. Roy reckoned that Linda was being a bit excessive in the suburbs, but the R80's speedo was broken and showed crazy speeds (is that a good excuse?) Roy was impressed by Sydney's light traffic at 1 pm — creepy crawly up to the bridge. We were glad to stop for lunch and a rest at Linda's folk's before out again to get new tyres and the RS's swingarm adjusted. That night we enjoyed a beautiful curry with Richard & Joy (Linda's brother and his wife). Richard seemed surprised that the bottle of port he opened for us was finished on the night. Richard is also a bike rider, so he gave us some tips on roads to try on the way south.

Thursday, early afternoon saw us heading out of Sydney. We kept fairly close to the coast and enjoyed the view at Bulli pass, but avoided Port Kembla and Wollongong. The Kiama Blowhole was pretty quiet due to the calm seas but its a good place for a break. On Richard's advice, we looped back a short distance to enjoy Maquarie Pass, between Jamberoo (10 metres above sea level) and Robertson (760 m asl), but theres only 10 km between the two. The area is lush rainforest and some of the hairpin bends have 15km advisory signs! The road gets lots of traffic on weekends but it is great on weekdays.

Thursday night we stayed at the Bushranger Hotel at Collector, just outside of Canberra. The food, beer and the staff were good but the mozzies were fierce.

Friday, we briefly stopped in Canberra and Cooma (it's bloody hot again), and enjoyed the trip through Kosciusko National Park. Near Thredbo, an eagle swooped off the mountain, and must have been startled by us and the tourist bus from the other direction, because it dropped a bundle of fur onto the road. It bounced, came up all ears, and the bunny ran off!

The 40km section of dirt around Mt K, was in better condition than expected, lightly corrugated and occasionally washed out near Geehi. Roy finally admitted he was impressed with the Metzlers, in the dirt (and fanging through Maquarie Pass). From there its an easy trip down the Murray Valley Highway to Walwa and the Clubman Rally. In fact, the rally was too close to the highway. Roy says that 90% of the site was uncampable (due to floodplain shale and sand — really shitty stuff that saw more than one bike lose its grip, or get bogged). But the Murray River was great and we were glad of the Lilo in Saturday's heat.

We saw Fred & Nellie – they send hellos to the SA MRA. Bruce, Karlyn, Les (Uncle Pervy), Jolyon and Kerry were also there. Bruce was having a few problems with the Guzzi, but you'd better ask him about that. (Must feel like old times for Fred, working on Bruce's bike again).

Sunday (late) saw us on the road with Joles & Kerry, heading to Shepparton, via the Hume Weir (not much to see at the weir, but a nice road). Monday was a quick sprint home to a hot bath and a half a bottle of port (its better in winter).





Congratulations on the success of the recent "Awareness Ride" which concluded at Bonython Park.


